Pending Legislation Concerning School-Based Health Centers

Senate Finance Committee amendments to House Appropriations and Finance Committee Substitute for HB2	GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF 2005 \$2,000,000 appropriated to DOH for <u>startup</u> of SBHCs. (Page 184, March 5, 2005)
SB779 (Senator Nava)	SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS Appropriates \$3,000,000 to <u>expand</u> and operate School-Based Health Centers (SBHCs).
SB761 (Senator Pinto) and HB552 (Representative Begaye), duplicate bills	SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CLINICS Appropriates \$2,000,000 to support <u>existing</u> SBHCs statewide.
House Business and Industry Committee Substitute for HB681	PERMIT FOR SALE OF FOOD IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS Require a permit from DOH to sell certain food or drink in public schools, fee based on student enrollment.
SB456 (Senator Beffort) and HB637 (Representative Picraux), duplicate bills	EXPAND PRIMARY CARE CAPITAL FUNDING ACT SBHCs and telehealth sites would become eligible for funding under the Primary Care Capital Funding Act.
Senate Public Affairs Committee Substitute for HB61	SCHOOL MEAL NUTRITION RULES Bill would enact a new section of the Public School Code requiring PED to promulgate rules governing foods and beverages that are sold or distributed in public schools.
SB937 (Senator Griego) and HB879 (Representative Campos), duplicate bills	LIQUOR EXCISE TAX REVENUE DISTRIBUTION Bill would change the distribution of liquor excise tax revenues in FY06. \$2,000,000 would be distributed to DOH to increase alcohol and substance abuse programs.
HCO942 (Representative Chavez)	PURCHASE OF A DOUBLE-WIDE TRAILER FOR A MOBILE TEEN HEALTH CENTER FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO IN THE TO'HAJILEE CHAPTER OF THE NAVAJO NATION Requests \$100,000.
